Dear Sir/Madam,

This is an extraordinary year for all of us as COVID19 has grappled our routine functions since beginning of the year. You might have initiated the necessary actions towards prevention and control of Dengue including planning, uninterrupted supply chain of diagnostics & insecticides, inter-sectoral coordination and IEC activities etc. to some extent amidst COVID19 pandemic. However, in many States VBD staff was engaged and continues to be engaged in COVID19 activities hampering field level activities particularly entomological monitoring including checking of larval breeding and vector control. Many of the States reported large number of cases before lockdown and it was apprehended that there may be upsurge of Dengue cases this year following the cyclical trend. Contrary to that, the data submitted since the month of May indicates negligible numbers of Dengue cases or even no case reported in some weeks by certain States. From the current reports also, it appears that there is no improvement in the diagnosis and capturing of Dengue cases in the Sentinel Surveillance Hospitals/Labs. It is a major concern in ongoing congenial conditions for transmission with high vector density during monsoon period which may suddenly lead to spurt in dengue cases and be very difficult to contain leading to overloading on our health facilities already burdened with COVID19.

It goes without saying that there is a dire need of intensification of all public health measures on war footing to minimize the morbidity and mortality associated with Dengue. Intensified efforts are also needed for keeping the vector density at a low level through anti-larval and anti-adult measures to minimize the risk of transmission.

A suggestive list of actions is enclosed herewith for reference. You may modify these activities based on local setup and requirement. I shall appreciate reinforcing all the preventive measures without further delay. Should you require any technical guidance, we will be happy to render.

Please keep this Directorate updated on the situation and actions taken for prevention and control of Dengue in your State.

Suggestive list of measures for prevention and control of Dengue

A: Entomological Surveillance and vector control

- Intensify entomological surveillance adhering to COVID19 guidelines and take preventive measures in areas reporting high density of *Aedes* mosquitoes
- Carry out source reduction activities mobilizing the community and anti-adult measures wherever necessary following the COVID19 guidelines
- Avoid fogging in the COVID19 Containment Zones as the smoke may further irritate the respiratory system of the affected persons

B. Disease Surveillance

- Ensure all identified Sentinel Surveillance Hospitals (SSHs) are conducting tests for Dengue cases. Adequate stock of diagnostic kits (ELISA based NS1 and IgM) should be made available in all SSHs
- Coordinate for timely reporting from all SSHs along with complete line-listing
- Take immediate actions through Rapid Response Team if any upsurge/outbreak is observed/reported

C. Case Management

- Ensure dedicated beds for Dengue patients in isolated Wards in hospitals
- To meet any emergency situation, ensure sufficient stock of blood components in blood banks
- Early referral of cases from periphery to avert complications and deaths

D. Logistics

- Monitor the stock position of insecticides (larvicides and adulticides) at all levels to avoid any stock out
- Keep all equipment in functioning condition

E. IEC for Community awareness

- Carry out IEC activities with concerned departments for community sensitization on Dengue following COVID19 guidelines
- Use Social media, electronic media for community awareness and encouraging source reduction activities to prevent *Aedes* breeding in their houses and surroundings

F. Inter-sectoral Coordination

- Liaison with Municipal bodies for entomological monitoring and to implement public health measures to prevent Dengue

G. Monitoring

- Closely monitor the disease situation on day to day basis and take immediate actions, wherever needed
- Coordinate with districts and municipalities for timely reporting of cases from hospitals (public and private)
- Ensure reporting from Entomological zones for vector surveillance and timely analysis of the reports
